## Publication Policy at NTNU Social Research



Scientific publication is one of NTNU Social Research's most important tasks. Scientific publication ensures quality of research and is an effective way of disseminating research outcomes. NTNU Social Research has an ambition for the institute's research to be shared with society and contribute to an informed public debate and knowledge-based decisions. NTNU Social Research adheres to the prevailing national policies and guidelines for open access and a general principle is that scientific publications are to be announced and made available. At the same time, the institute's results are managed in accordance with the established boundaries for secrecy and duty of confidentiality. The institute encourages and contributes to open access to scientific publications, at the same time as choice of publication channels shall be in accordance with the principles for professional and academic freedom.

• NTNU Social Research's scientific publications shall be deposited in the institutional science archive Samforsk Open. Reservations can be made unless demanded by the client, or if it causes disagreement with the co-authors.

• NTNU Social Research recommends using Creative Commons licences for open publication, preferably <u>CC BY 4.0</u>. The licence policy of the publication channel will be decisive for choice of licence. Specific licence terms shall be established if required by the funder.

## **Rights to scientific articles**

NTNU Social Research's Rights Retention Strategy (RRS) contributes to the institute fulfilling requirements from research funders by making scientific publications available to the general public, without delay (embargo). Researchers at NTNU Social Research retain their rights without further information to the publisher. They can make available the latest version of their peer-reviewed, accepted manuscript (AAM – Author Accepted Manuscript) with the use of self-archiving (Green OA). NTNU Social Research has the legal responsibility for distribution via the institutional science archive Samforsk Open. NTNU Social Research's Rights Strategy applies to scientific articles published after April 20th 2023.

Through this policy, NTNU Social Research is notifying scientific publications that accepted, peer-reviewed manuscripts from the institution's staff members are made available online under a Creative Commons sharing licence. This applies irrespective of subsequent agreements entered into with publishing houses and publishers.
